Combining a mission trip and intense retreat program, the Mission addresses the Christian calls to community, service, and prayer. Youth groups from around the Diocese of Lansing join together to serve and pray, making friendships to fully display the Catholic family has no geographic boundaries! The day begins with Mass, then students head to their work sites. Sites exist from one side of Flint to the next: Eastside Mission, Catholic Charities, Carriage town, St. Paul Street Evangelizing and more! 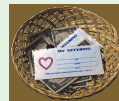

EVANGELIZATION

Evangelization has always been essential to the Church’s mission. These short articles are part of continuing series to highlight this fact as seen in Catholic teaching over the past 50 years. Here is a short description of the next document on our list.*

Catechesi Tradendae (Catechesis in Our Times) by Pope St. John Paul II
http://www.vatican.va/holy_father/paul_vi/apost_exhortations/documents/hf_p-vi_exh_19751208_evangelii-nuntiandi_en.html was published by St. John Paul a year after he became Pope. Like many other magisterial documents, it was the fruit of an Episcopal Synod – in this case, to tackle the challenges of catechesis in contemporary culture. Catechesis reaffirmed and emphasized age old teaching that the aim of catechesis is “intimacy with Jesus” (CT #5) The main goal of Religious Education and faith formation is to initiate people into an intimate relationship with the living Jesus. Apart from the Sacraments, which are the most direct way to Jesus, here are a few events and programs at Holy Redeemer that respond to the Church’s call to the new evangelization:

- **Encounter Fridays** – Eucharistic Praise & Worship every 1st Fridays at 6:30pm in the Church
- **Empower Fridays** – Inspired worship and anointed teaching every 3rd Fridays at 6:30pm in the Underground
- **The Alpha Course**– is a no-pressure way of learning and experiencing the most basic yet powerful tenets of our Faith. It involves 10 weeks of a nice meal and discussion with friends. The Alpha Course begins on **Wed Sept. 7 at 6:30pm and Sun, Sept 11 at noon.**

HOPE IN FLINT DAY – SEPTEMBER 10



Deacons from around the Diocese of Lansing are gathering at St. Mary’s Church in Flint for a day of hope. St. Mary’s is located in the northeast side of Flint and there is a push being made to reach out to the local community; to let them know the church is present and available to serve, pray, and be for them. The day will consist of adoration, reconciliation, food, games for children, and walking the neighborhood “two by two.”

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED!

The hope is to give away school supplies to the children that come to St. Mary’s. Donations of pens, pencils, crayons, markers, notebooks etc. are needed. St. Mary’s also has a food pantry that serves the neighborhood. Nonperishable food items and toiletries are needed. Please leave your items at the welcome desk after the masses.

More importantly though, we need people to come to Flint and pray. Please bring your youth group, your bible study group, your prayer team, your family, you. Come pray a rosary outside in the parking lot, host your bible study group in the outdoors. Come be a visible, living sign that the Church is alive.

This is HOPE. Eucharistic Adoration will be from 10a.m.-4p.m., Bishop Boyea will celebrate Mass at 4:30p.m. Every one is welcome.
