FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Poyo is back this weekend for one day for our adult version of the youth retreat at Steubenville. Deacon Ralph Poyo, that is, who is an inspiring speaker to the thousands of youth that attend the Steubenville Youth Conference. A year ago he joined us for our Mission and he had one message that really caught my attention: Using a wheelbarrow, Deacon Poyo inspired us with the message of Jesus that if we want to be his disciple, we have to be *all in*.

Deacon Poyo was using the amazing story of Charles Blondin, a famous French tightrope walker, as a wonderful illustration of what true faith is. Blondin's greatest fame came on September 14, 1860, when he became the first person to cross a tightrope stretched 11,000 feet (over a quarter of a mile) across the mighty Niagara Falls. People from both Canada and America came from miles away to see this great feat. He walked across, 160 feet above the falls, several times... each time with a different daring feat - once in a sack, on stilts, on a bicycle, in the dark, and blindfolded. One time he even carried a stove and cooked an omelet in the middle of the rope! A large crowd gathered and the buzz of excitement ran along both sides of the river bank. The crowd "Oohed and Aahed!" as Blondin carefully walked across - one dangerous step after another - pushing a wheelbarrow holding a sack of potatoes.



They said they believed. But... their actions proved they truly did not believe. Similarly, it is one thing for us to say we believe in God. However, it's true faith when we believe in God and put all our faith and trust in His Son, Jesus Christ.

Then at one point, he asked for the participation of a volunteer. Upon reaching the other side, the crowd's applause was louder than the roar of the falls! Blondin suddenly stopped and addressed his audience: "Do you believe I can carry a person across in this wheelbarrow?" The crowd enthusiastically yelled, "Yes! You are the greatest tightrope walker in the world. We believe!"

"Okay," said Blondin, *"Who wants to get into the wheelbarrow."*

As far as the Blondin story goes, no one did at the time!

This unique story illustrates a real life picture of what faith actually is. The crowd watched these daring feats. *They said they believed. But... their actions proved they truly did not believe.* Similarly, it is one thing for us to say we believe in God. However, it's true faith when we believe in God and put all our faith and trust in His Son, Jesus Christ.

These were also the words of Jesus this last week in the Gospel too. If we want to follow him, we must not value anything else in comparison to the value we put on following Jesus—even father and mother, wife and children, brother and sister, *even our own life!* We must abandon everything else, renounce everything else if we would be his disciple. We must seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, then all the blessings of God in this world will be poured out on us. When we prioritize Jesus to first place in our life without any other equal, then everything else falls into place and enjoys God's blessing.

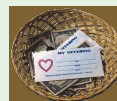

St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher over the tomb. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman.

Cornelius and Cyprian the Bishop of Carthage, did not believe in the need for re-baptism for Catholics who stopped practicing their religion. Instead they thought that the sinners should only need to show contrition and true repentance to be welcomed back into the church.

He was an Italian Jesuit and a Cardinal of the Catholic Church. He was one of the most important figures in the Counter-Reformation. He was a professor of theology and later rector of the Roman College, and supported the reform decrees of the Council of Trent. He is also widely remembered for his role in the Giordano Bruno affair and the Galileo affair.

EVANGELIZATION

So far we've looked at descriptions of 6 authoritative Church documents that show how evangelization has always been essential to the Church's mission: Lumen Gentium, Gaudium et Spes, Evangelii Nuntiandi, the General Directory for Catechesis, Catechesis Tradendae & Christi Fidelis Laici. Here a short description of the next document on our list.

Redemptoris Missio (Christ the Redeemer) was published by Pope St. John Paul II in December of 1990. Many Catholics fall into the trap of thinking that evangelization was a thing of the past – that the modern era is an era of tolerance. After all, doesn't Jesus calls us to love and be accepting of whatever people believe? However, although Jesus calls us to love, he doesn't call us to be content with what others believe. He doesn't leave room for that. In fact, our love should motivate us to bring the whole world to Jesus. **Redemptoris Missio** reminds us that there is only one redeemer and because of this, Jesus' message of salvation, proclaimed through the Church, is more relevant than ever.
