



Nuovo Millenio Ineute (At the Beginning of the New Millenium), was released by Pope St. John Paul II in 2001 at the closing of the great jubilee year. In it, St. John Paul reaffirmed the mission of the Church. There is no need to invent a "new program," he said. "The program already exists." In the 3rd millennium, the Church is called to be ever more vigilant in its mission to spread the message of salvation that is found in Christ alone. We are the Church at the dawn of the new millennium. We are called to answer this ancient call with a renewed freshness.
